Reinstating COVID protocols

We have decided to reinstate several of our COVID protocols beginning tomorrow, Sunday, Dec 17th – they include:

- 1- We are encouraging parishioners to wear masks

- 3- There should be no contact with icons, crosses, chalice, and liturgical items. You may venerate the icons by simply making the sign of the cross and bowing towards them.
- 4- We will be returning to individual sanitized spoons for Communion.
